

B5 FINAL UPDATE



B5 is a local group based in Kennewick, and they offer services for immigrants in our area. They started out as a small church and pivoted into a social movement, gathering volunteers to tutor English to adults or support after-school kids activities.

Theresa Rosendaal, the Director of B5, shared a message about their work with us on Sunday, June 05. Our Social Concerns committee wanted to provide support by pledging funds, as the direct items (specific textbooks/materials) are not eligible for our standard blue bin donation format. They also opened the matter to the congregation, and we responded in force.

Our congregation raised \$455 for the B5 Learning Center this summer! We plan to gather a group to deliver the check at the groundbreaking for their new facility on July 11 at 9 AM, email the office to be part of the group! *Image credit, Tumbleweird*

PROPERTY SALE UPDATE

Things are moving forward though a little slower than anticipated. To date the area we are intending to sell has been surveyed. The next step involves getting the survey data drafted into a formal drawing of the area by the end of July. That will provide us with an official copy of our borders of the proposed sale area (which we have never actually known).

At that point, the drawing will be taken to the city of Richland to verify that the proposed sale will meet the city's codes. While we are confident this proceed as planned, it is important to verify this before incurring the additional costs to make the sale go forward. 


